SUBJECT AREA AND COURSE NUMBER: ART G100-01

COURSE TITLE: Art Appreciation

COURSE CATALOG DESCRIPTION: An introduction to the broad spectrum of the visual arts, past and present. Emphasis is upon the visual language employed by artists and the historical and cultural significance of works of art.
