Section II

Course Scope and Content: Intermediate Spanish I is a language course designed for students who have successfully completed one year of Spanish and wish to develop further reading, writing, and speaking skills, and gain cultural knowledge and awareness of the Spanish speaking world. Intermediate Spanish I will cover lessons 27 through 38 in the required texts, videos, and audiocassettes.
