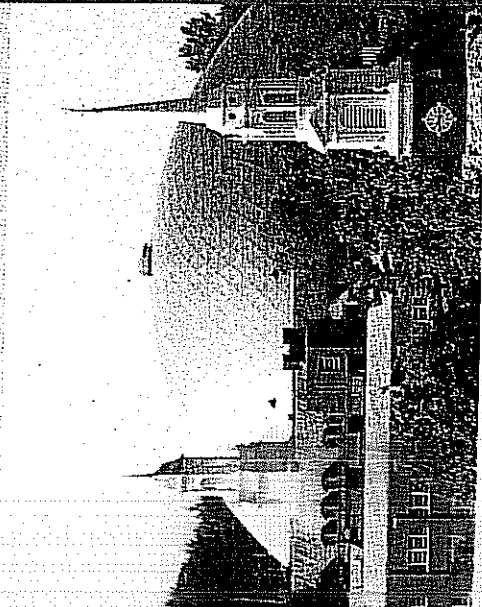

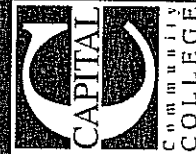
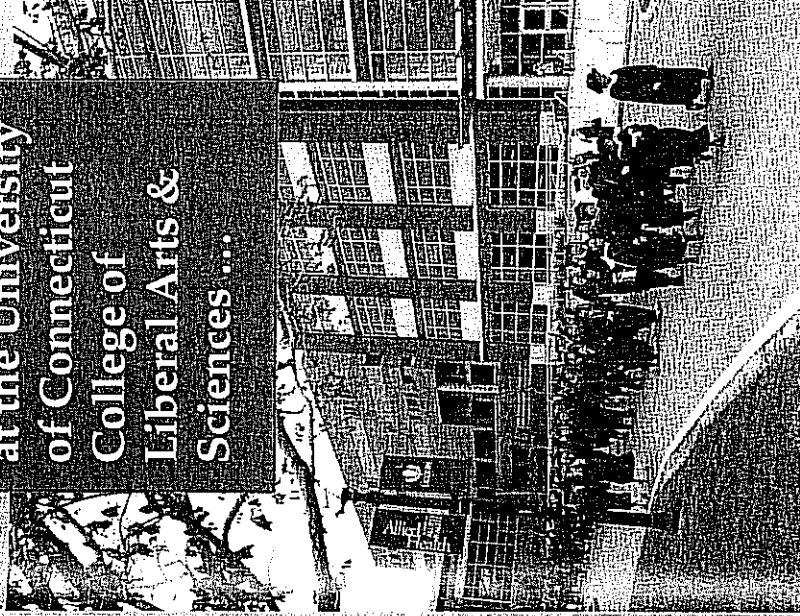

What is the GA Program at Capital?

The Guaranteed Admission program at Capital is an agreement between Capital Community College and the University of Connecticut that guarantees admission to UConn's College of Liberal Arts & Sciences, provided that certain requirements are met.

What are the Requirements for the GA Program at Capital?

Students at Capital must earn a 3.0 minimum cumulative grade point average and an associate degree in a Liberal Arts transfer program in order to qualify.

Who at Capital is eligible to participate in the GA Program?

Students who enroll at Capital with up to 15 transferable credits are eligible to participate. Former UConn degree-seeking students are not eligible to participate.

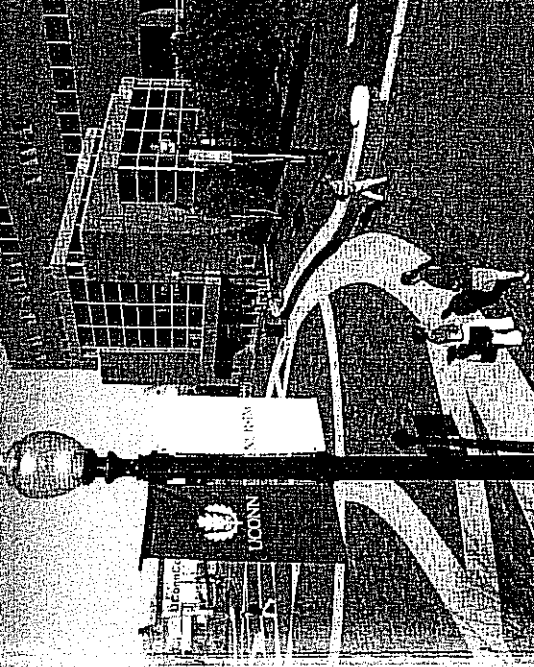
