Career Exploration Exercise "Making the Right Choices"

Instructions for completing the Interest Profiler using Choices software

- 1) Go to <u>www.bridges.com/ct</u>
- 2) In the sign-in area, click on "Site Id" and enter the following information: Site ID: 0110687 Password: capitalcc
- 3) Click on the box labeled "Choices Planner."
- 4) On the far right under "Your Portfolio", click on "Create a portfolio." Portfolio name: Your banner number with the @ symbol
 Password: 4-16 characters and cannot be the same as your portfolio name. Email: use your student college email not your personal email. This will be helpful if you need to retrieve/reset your password if you ever forget it.
- 5) Click on "Interest Profiler."

Click on "Start Answering Questions."

About the assessment:

- You will respond to 60 questions that represent important interest areas by clicking on: Like, Not Sure, Dislike
- Answer all the questions honestly. This is merely a tool to help you learn more about yourself and possible career choices
- > This is NOT a test there are no wrong answers


6) Printing or saving your results:

- 1) To receive full-credit, <u>you must submit a printout of your Interests Profiler</u> and the "What they Do" page for each of your two career choices. (5 points)
- 2) What are your top two interest areas (according to the results of your Interests Profiler)? What do these mean? Do the results of the Interests Profiler surprise you or confirm what you already knew about yourself? Explain. (10 points)
- 3) What <u>two</u> careers did you decide to explore for this assignment? List at least three tasks these careers require you to do. (10 points)
- 4) According to information found in *Choices*, What are some of the skills that are required in these careers?(10 points)
- 5) According to information found in *Choices*, what level of education and degree(s) are required in order to pursue these careers? (10 points)
- 6) How much money can you expect to earn if you were to pursue these careers? (10 points)
- List two interesting facts about each of these careers that you found either on an association or related website? List the websites where you found this information. (10 points)
- 8) Use the attached worksheets to compare the two careers. (25 points each)
